- Christians can pray in any place, but the most common location is in a building called a church. Churches can be very different - old, new, plain or highly decorated. Often, the floor plans of churches are shaped in a cross.
- Church services often include hymns, prayers, and readings from the Bible.
- The Bible is the holy book of Christians. It contains the Old and New Testaments.
- The Old Testament is similar to the Jewish Bible and was written before Jesus' birth.
- The New Testament tells us the life and stories of Jesus.
- Christians believe that people should be compassionate to one another, and show respect to God, themselves and one
- Christians believe that praying to God helps them to say sorry for the things that they have done wrong, and thank them for the blessings given to them.
- . There are many different denominations (types) of Christians. All Christians were once Catholics, but other groups branched off many years ago.
- The biggest Christian denomination is still Catholicism. To Catholics, the Pope is Christ's representative on earth. Other major groups include Protestants (including Anglican) Church of England faiths) and Orthodox.

- Commitment is a promise to give your time and energy to something you believe
- A commitment doesn't have to be religious. Commitments can be made to family, friendships, a healthy lifestyle, learning a skill or achieving a goal.

Religious commitments can be made

- once a person reaches a certain age. These commitments are special rituals
 - people do when they come of age to show commitment to their faith.

The Ten Commandments.

In the Bible, God reveals to Moses ten commandments, which Christians should aim to live their lives by:



1. You shall have no other Gods but me. 2. You shall not make for yourself any idol. 3. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God. 4. You shall remember and keep the Sabbath day holy. 5. Respect your father and mother. 6. You must not commit murder. 7. You must not commit adultery. 8. You must not steal. 9. You must not give false evidence against your neighbour. 10. You must not be envious of your neighbour's goods.
